Jubilee

Town Bunting installed - new contractor High Maintenance only second time he's installed bunting. Bunting is made from Synthetic paper which can be recycled and is more environmentally friendly than plastic.

Successful event with lots of positive feedback from people on social media, word of mouth and email . Fireworks were amazing - see BID Facebook for images and video

£5,280 funding secured – National Lottery Community Fund towards the street closure, security, marketing, event management plans, hire of tables and chairs and some towards entertainment – music and stilt walkers.

Music provided by Bagas Porthia- strolling band to ensure all town benefited

Stilt walkers by Boom Circus – strolled around to ensure all businesses benefited

Yoga for 4yr over on Harbour beach by emma at Show Case Studio's at Drill Hall

Community workshops (part of funding agreement) - Plain white bunting provided to St Uny and St Ives Juniors, a community group at St Johns and young people who attend swimming lesson at leisure centre. The resources (jubilee style stencil and paints) provided by Barnoon Workshop who also collected and delivered the bunting. The finished bunting was hung at Leisure Centre Reception aera and over the pool.

Shop Window Jubilee design – Kirsty Arthur asked how she could support the Big Lunch. SS asked if she could attended, talk to community and choose her favourite/s design and report back to SS

Shore Shelter and Rose Lodge open for an hour and information about Cornish Language provided by Cornish Language Fellowship.

Kirsty Arthur, Johnnie Wells and Linda Taylor attended.

Rev. Nick Widdows blessed the Big Lunch celebrations

Businesses off and on the wharf had a mixed trading day, with some saying it was the best for a long time and other reporting sales were low.

Many comment to SS about how lovely it was with no traffic on Wharf, but the benefits were felt around the town. One business said less traffic enabled people to browse her shop on High Street and she reported having 'one of her best days in a long time' which the business credited to the road closure.

The police did not report any incidents. Security team did support one business after some teenagers (believed to be visitor) stole from them

Police and anti-social behaviour

BID did a call around and sent an email to all businesses asking for all licenced premises to attend Pub Watch meeting – and it was reported to be the biggest turn out in many months. Pub watch meet monthly on the first Tuesday of the month at 10am in Western. BID are working with Police and stakeholders to address anti social and criminal behaviour in town (Security is a BID theme in the Business Plan 2019 - 2024)

Currently BID is facilitating discussions with Flashlight, Salvation Army and Tate around a project for young people.

SS liaising with police which lead to several assemblies to young people led by police at ST Ives School.

Bystander Training (Home Office Initiative) led by Safer Cornwall Team have approached BID to ask for their support to promote the training in St Ives . Wetherspoon will host the training and date and time tbc but likely to be Thursday $30^{\rm th}$ June 10-11.30am: See blurb below

"Safer Cornwall is delivering free training for bar/club/taxi and public transport staff across the county. The team have developed a training package which will give individuals the skills, confidence and strategies to sport vulnerability or people behaving inappropriately, and know what to say and do to achieve the best outcome in a given situation. The training seeks to create a community of 'active' bystanders working in each of our towns in order to help build a resilient and safer night-time economy for all to enjoy."

Police petition – regarding to lack of police presence in town - over 200 signatures from BID members sent to Alison Hernandez – no response so far. Andrew Mictchel mentioned at Town Council meeting that if statistics continue to raise St Ives will be designated 'Safer Town' status. Board would like to see an additional fulltime PCSO in town, which will help in crease police presence (the premise for the petition)

Linda Taylor will chase on BID's behalf.
